NEW! Walk and Roll day

Walk and Roll day at Jordan is coming on **Thursday, October 5**. If you are not a regular bicycle or pedestrian commuter, October 5 is your day to try alternative transportation. So check your bike now, make sure it is working. Find your bike helmet and make sure it still fits. Find your scooter, or check out the bus or shuttle schedule. Form a carpool with your friends. Choose an alternative to coming to Jordan alone in a car. See you October 5th!

NEW! Cycling Safely to School amidst Traffic

Please remind your children and students to obey the traffic rules and ride cautiously:

1. Wear your helmet and buckle it.
2. Always assume cars do not see you, make eye contact when possible, and move cautiously through intersections.
3. Stop the herd habit!--groups of bikes are not stopping at stop signs! Since cars will want their lawful turn at an intersection, it is a dangerous assumption that bikes can just plow through a stop sign.
4. As we move closer to winter, don't forget to remind your kids that if the sun is in THEIR eyes, it is also in the eyes of car drivers coming up behind them. Always keep to the right shoulder and try to be aware of upcoming cars.
5. A bicycle is a vehicle. Ride your bike on the same side of the road as cars going the same direction. Do not ride the wrong way, or on the sidewalk.

As part of Palo Alto's Healthy City, Healthy Community priority set by the City Council, Palo Alto is partnering again this year with the Palo Alto Family YMCA to bring a speakers series, group exercise classes, interactive booths, fitness and nutrition classes, and other wellness events to the third annual Palo Alto Community Health Fair on Saturday, Sept. 23.
