

Executive Board Position. Provide advice regarding parliamentary procedures and by-laws. Attend monthly Executive Board meetings and Association meetings. Convenes Nominating Committee in Spring for following year. Revise by-laws every 2 years.

#### **Book Fair Chair (1-2)**

Work with two (2) Jordan Librarians to coordinate four book selling events: Scholastic during the first week of school, a holiday event at Books, Inc. in December, Scholastic in the Spring, and Kepler's in May. Schedule dates of book events, arrange advertising, organize volunteer schedule, solicit for volunteers, organize logistics of set-up and close-down, report financial information to Scholastic, and coordinate refreshments when needed.

#### **International Fair Coordinators (3-5)**

International Fair Coordinators meet in August and September to plan for the annual International Fair. Country Tables (food and cultural displays), evening program (dances, music, art display) and raffle prize giveaways -- are the program's major components. This is a great way to work with a small group of parents to plan and carry out this popular and highly anticipated Jordan Wed evening community building event that celebrates our school's diversity.
